Attacking player A7 is standing in the goal crease while the puck is at the point; no significant contact is made between goalie and A7. However, the goalie is screened and unable to cut off the angle. The attacking defense A9 shoots the puck and scores. State Referee's decision. (Rule 7.3b)

Correct

- a) No physical goalie interference. Good Goal
- b) Call a penalty to A7 for goalie interference. No Goal. You must call a penalty to disallow the goal
- c) Call a penalty to A7 for Goalie interference. Good goal.
- d) No goal as A7 proceeded the puck into the crease and prevented the goalie from tending goal. No penalty because A7 did not do anything else illegal under other rules.



With 3:53 left in the second, there is an event (i.e. the lights go out in one end of the arena) that stops play for a significant period of time. True or false, the Referee may send the teams to the dressing rooms, have the ice flooded, and add the 3:53 to the third period (Hockey Canada 10.17e)

Correct

- a) True.
- b) True, because the event occurred in the last 5 minutes of any period.
- c) True, because the event occurred in the last 5 minutes of the first or second period.
- d) False. Wait at the bench and finish the period.



Team B dumps the puck up the ice and B6 races after it as Goaltender A rushes out of the net to play the puck. The

goaltender misjudges the timing and misses the play but manages to get the puck in her glove, holding on to it to create a stoppage. What should the referee do? (Rule 10.3b Situation 3 point 4)

Correct

- Assess a minor penalty for delay of game, no warning.
- Give a warning, assess a penalty for delay of game next time.
- No penalty, no warning. Face-off at one of the end-zone dots.



A11 has the puck behind B's net. She tries to bounce the puck off the base of the net to get around B6. However, the net is slightly deformed and the puck goes under the net and into the slot. What should the referee do? (Rule 10.11c, situation 3).

Correct

- a) let play continue.
- b) stop play if team A gets the puck.
- c) stop play if team B gets the puck.
- d) stop play not matter what.



What penalty is assessed to a player or goaltender who participates in the play with a broken stick? (Rule 3.2a)

Correct

- A. No penalty
- B. A Major penalty
- C. A Minor penalty
- D. A Bench Minor penalty



True or False, Where there is suspicion that a player has sustained a serious injury, any on-ice official may stop the play before the team of the injured player has the puck. (Rule 2.6g, Note 1)

The Home team always gets to choose the end of the ice they defend in period 1. When must they make their decision? (Hockey Canada Rule 1.9e, Situation 2)

Correct

- Before the puck is dropped for the start of the game.
- When they fill out the game sheet.
- Before warm-ups
- Before the teams go on the ice.



At the same stoppage, team A gets two minor penalties and Team B gets one. The result is Team A killing a 2 minute minor penalty. Where does the next face-off take place? (HC Rule 4.13a)

Correct

- a) at the closest face-off dot to the stoppage of play
- b) in team A's end.
- c) in team B's end.
- d) at the closest neutral zone dot.



Select all that apply. What are the penalty options for spearing? (Rule 8.5, HC Rule Book)

Correct

- a) A Match Penalty to anyone.
- b) a 2+2 penalty to anyone
- c) A Match penalty if a player or team official deliberately spears another player.
- d) A 2+2 to any player for an attempted spear or jab.
- e) A minor penalty to anyone.
- f) A minor penalty and game misconduct to anyone.
- g) A 2+2 and Gross Misconduct to a team official who jabs or attempts to spear an opposing player.



Team B calls a timeout. May Team A take a timeout at the same stoppage? (Hockey Canada 10.17F, note 2)

Correct

- Yes. So long as they ask before the puck is dropped.
- No. Never. Only 1 timeout per stoppage is permitted.
- Yes, so long as Team A asks the Referee before Team B's timeout is over.



- Yes, so long as Team A asks for the timeout at the same time as Team B.
- Yes, so long as the official has not complete line change and blown play in for puck drop.
